

*Achievement is a score ranging from 0 to 100 gauging how well students perform on state tests. These tests include MAP, KPREP, End-of-Course Evaluations (EOCs) and the ACT. A school receives 1 point for each percent of students scoring proficient or distinguished, half a point for each percent of students scoring apprentice, and 0 points for novice. If the percent of students scoring distinguished transcends the percent of students scoring novice, bonus points are awarded.
